Diversity in the Legal Profession: Facts and Fiction

- According to the ABA, only 22.1% of all recipients of *juris doctorate* degrees identified themselves as members of minority groups in 2009.
- Approximately 35% of all Americans now recognized themselves as members of a racial or ethnic minority group, and that percentage continues to increase.
- Research indicates that new attorneys of color are more likely than their young White colleagues to provide legal services in urban areas, become civically engaged, work in a public interest law practice, and offer *pro bono* (free) legal services.
- Demographics in America reflect a 13-20% gap in the number of minority attorneys available to advocate for the members of racial and ethnic minority groups, represent minority-owned business, and serve as leaders within our communities of color.
