CAVEAT:

Any discrepancies may adversely affect your admission to the bar. Full descriptions of these actions or notations, including the reasons for removal, must appear. Of particular importance are juvenile or minor matters for which the court has sealed the records. Many bar examiners take the position that the records are not sealed for purposes of admission to the bar.
