

Free Movement, the European Union and Immigration Law

In the European Union, there is generally a right for EU citizens to move freely between the EU member countries. This has implications for immigration law (or migration law, as it is called in the EU). How far does this right to free movement extend? What restrictions, if any, may member states place on those who wish to activate free movement rights? If an EU citizen is married to a non- EU citizen, does the non- EU spouse have free movement rights as well?

Dr. Helena Wray will introduce the concept of free movement rights in the European Union and will address how these rights implicate immigration law.



Q. What should I put in my shoe box?

Suggestions: (Toys) small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, yo-yos, jump ropes; (School supplies) pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, writing pad, solar calculators; (Hygiene items) toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, comb, washcloth; (Other) hard candy, lollipops, mints, gum, sunglasses, ball caps, socks, t-shirts, toy jewelry, hair clips, watches, small picture books

Q. Is there anything I should not include?

A. Yes, do not include used items, war-related items, chocolate or perishable food items, liquids (shampoo, lotion, bubbles), medicines, breakable items (mirrors, snow globes)

Q. Do I have to use a shoe box?

A. No, you may also use a similarly sized plastic storage container with a removable lid. Place a rubber band around your box and lid. Tape a label and envelope containing \$7 to the top.

Q. Can I wrap my shoe box?

A. Yes, but please remember to wrap the lid separately.


