IMPORTANT INFORMATION

FINAL EXAMINATIONS

As final examinations approach, all students should take a few minutes to review the Law School rules relating to examinations. These rules may be found in §607-609 of the Academic Code and §203-205 of the Dean's Office Regulations.

According to $\S607$ (f)(l) of the Code, all examinations are graded anonymously. Students should not discuss the examination process, including the possibility of exam deferral or exam accommodation with faculty members. Any attempt by a student to identify himself/herself to a professor by placing notes or messages on an examination or exam booklet compromises the anonymous grading system. All questions should be directed to Associate Dean of Student Affairs office or the Registrar's Office. Any compromise of the anonymous grading system by a student constitutes a violation of the Code of Conduct and could result in suspension or expulsion.

Permission to defer an examination will be granted only in extreme cases. Students should refer to the guidelines. Emergency deferrals will be granted to those students who, for medical reasons, are unable to sit for an examination when scheduled. A student who becomes ill and cannot take an examination when scheduled must call the Registrar's Office before the examination begins. If that student cannot appear in person or call the Registrar, he/she may miss the exam and apply for a deferral. An application for this type of deferral must be made within 48 hours of the original exam date and in no event later than the last day of regularly scheduled exams. The student must also provide the Registrar's Office with a letter from the attending physician which confirms that the student was unable to sit for the examination due to illness. Students who begin an examination and leave due to illness may not make up the examination on the makeup day. The examination must be retaken at the end of the next semester in which the course is offered.

Exam Reminders

Anonymous numbers. Anonymous numbers must be placed on all examination booklets and on the examination itself. In the unlikely event you forget to put your anonymous number on your papers before time is called, you may do so at the proctor's table when you turn in your exam. If you continue to write after the proctor has told you to stop, your examination number and the fact that you did not stop when told will be reported to the Registrar's Office and may ultimately be reported to the Office of Student Affairs.

Open book exams. You may bring into an open book exam only those items designated by the professor. If you are in doubt as to what can be brought into the exam, check with your professor before the examination.

Scrap paper. Scrap paper will only be permitted in an examination if the professor has specifically told the Registrar that it will be permitted. The proctor will distribute one scrap paper book to you during the examination.

Lavatory breaks. You are reminded that the honor code applies during the entire exam and a lavatory break does not mean there is a break in the honor code rules.

Student ID. Finally, remember to bring your <u>student ID</u> to each of your examinations. Students <u>must</u> be positively identified by the Registrar or proctor before sitting for each exam.

Students are reminded that the Student Code of Conduct §202(1) requires you to report all Code of Conduct violations.

Benefits of Glass Recycling

Glass is a material recycled by many curbside collection programs, and it is also accepted at most municipal recycling centers. Here are some of the important reasons to recycle glass containers:



- The typical glass container is made up of as much as 70% recycled glass.
- It is estimated that 80% of recycled glass, as a whole, will end up as new glass containers.
- Unlike other substances such as paper, glass can be recycled infinitely without any loss of purity or quality.
- To create new glass, substances such as sand must be heated to 2,600° Fahrenheit, which consumes energy and creates pollution from factories.
- Recycled glass first becomes "cullet," or crushed glass. When making

new products from cullet, 40% less energy is consumed in place of making glass from new products, because it melts at a lower temperature than virgin ingredients.

• A glass bottle can take up to 1,000,000 years to breakdown.



- A recycled glass container can go from a recycling bin to a store shelf in as little as 30 days and can be recycled over and over again with losing its purity.
 - Because glass is made from naturally-occurring materials like sand, it has a low rate of chemical interaction with the contents of the container, which makes it a safe material to be reused.
 - Recycled glass can be used in numerous areas, such as creating sports turf, manufacturing kitchen tiles and providing sand to depleted beaches.

Date: Students who wish to compete in the Superior Authorship Competition must submit their paper topics NO LATER THAN 5 P.M., APRIL 29, 2009. Send topics via e-mail to: wjler@mail.widener.edu with "Att: Editorial Board - Superior Authorship topic" in the subject line.

Class level: Rising 3RD, 3ED, and 4ED students

GPA: Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.70 (determined after grades returned from Registrar)

Paper criteria: Please submit papers in 12-point Times New Roman font, double-spaced with one-inch margins on each page. Page numbers must be centered on the bottom of each page. Citations should be footnotes in proper BlueBook format. Seminar papers will be accepted.

Due date: No later than 5 p.m., June 11, 2009.

Note to competitors: Submission instructions and additional details will be provided to each competitor once the student has submitted a topic.

Closed Write-On Competition

Class level: Rising 2RD, 3ED, and 1ED students who will be matriculating into the Regular Division in the Fall 2009 semester

GPA: Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.70 (determined after grades returned from Registrar)

A to Z List Makes Finding Online Journals Easy

Under **Databases** on the Law Library's home page is the link to the **A to Z Electronic Journal List**. By entering the title of a journal, you will be given links to wherever there is an electronic version, from Lexis and Westlaw to ProQuest or EBSCO to HeinOnline or the publisher's own website. Links to online journals can also be found by entering the title of the journal in the Library Catalog.

In the record for the journal that shows the Library's paper holdings, there will usually be one or more links to an online version. Due to space limitations, the Library no longer has older



issues of many journals and relies on the pdf versions found in electronic databases. Once you have found the issue online that you are seeking, you can scroll down to the page citation of an article or search by terms. If the issue you need is not included in an online database, and the Library does not have it on the shelf, you may request it by clicking on Interlibrary Loan at the top of the Library Catalog screen. Ask a Reference Librarian for help if you have questions about ILL.
