Is Your Laptop Exam Ready

As the semester quickly progresses and the thoughts of exams begin to linger, it is essential to not only mentally prepare for your exams, but also prepare your laptop as well. The ITS department wants to help ensure that you have one less thing to worry about as exam time quickly approaches. Below are some tips for updating common software on your computer to avoid problems before they occur.



UPDATING WINDOWS

Windows XP

- Navigate to Windows Update by choosing Start→All <u>Programs</u>→Windows Update.
- Choose the Scan for Updates link.
- When the scan completes select the updates you want to install.
- Repeat until all updates are installed.

Windows Vista & 7

- Navigate to Windows Update by choosing Start→All <u>Programs</u>→Windows Update.
- Choose Check for **Updates** link on the left.
- Select the updates you want to install.
- Repeat until all updates are installed.

Windows 8 & 8.1

- From the start screen, swipe the right of the screen (or the right of the mouse pad). Go to Settings then Change PC Settings at the bottom right.
- Go to Windows Update
- Choose Check for **Updates Now**
- Click on any updates you want to install.
- Repeat until all updates are installed.

Some security updates for windows are marked as Optional. These updates are still required to access wireless at Widener's campuses.



UPDATING OS X

- OS X 10.6 Lion, Leopard, Snow Leopard (10.6 and earlier)
 - From your desktop, click on the Apple logo on the top left of the screen.
 - Click Software Update... 0
- **OS X Mountain Lion**
 - From your desktop, click on the Apple logo on the top left of the screen.
 - Click Software Update...
 - If any updates are available select Update All



UPDATING SYMANTEC ENDPOINT PROTECTION

- From your Windows Desktop navigate to the system tray next to your clock.
- Double click the shield icon. If the shield icon is not visible click the arrow that faces up.
- If the status is Green, your Symantec is up to date.
- If your status is not Green and reads virus definitions are out of date, click Fix All. This will automatically run Symantec's Update program.

Law Student Tax Challenge ABA Section of Taxation Law Student Tax Challenge 13th Annual Law Student Tax Challenge (2013-2014)

An alternative to traditional moot court competitions, the Law Student Tax Challenge asks two-person teams of students to solve a cutting-edge and complex business problem that might arise in everyday tax practice. Teams are initially evaluated on two criteria: a memorandum to a senior partner and a letter to a client explaining the result. Based on the written work product, six teams from the J.D. Division and four teams from the LL .M. Division receive a free trip (including airfare and accommodations for two nights) to the Section of Taxation 2014 Midyear Meeting, January 23-25 in Phoenix, AZ, where each team will defend its submission before a panel of judges consisting of the country's top tax practitioners and government officials, including tax court judges. The competition is a great way for law students to showcase their knowledge in a real-world setting and gain valuable exposure to the tax law community. On average, more than 50 teams compete in the J.D. Division and more than 30 teams compete in the LL .M. Division.



CALI also produces Lawdibles, a series of short podcasts on legal topics. The first time you use CALI you'll need to register for an account. You'll need the Widener authorization code.
